RESEARCH STATEMENT (if applicable)

My research has focused on improving the health of populations through conducting systematic reviews of interventions aimed at improving patient and provider compliance with recommended preventive and other services. In addition, I have focused extensively on planning, implementing and evaluating community-based initiatives aimed at improving the health of Medicaid beneficiaries.

Since 1998, I have worked on systematic literature reviews that aim to identify effective strategies for improving vaccination uptake and adherence to clinical practice guidelines. I have been directing and leading a Cochrane Collaboration systematic literature review and meta-analysis aimed at assessing the effectiveness of implementation strategies, including audit and feedback, provider reminder systems, and patient reminder and recall systems, on vaccination rates. Most of this effort has involved volunteer unpaid work from the entire project team. I served as Principal Investigator on this project since our first update in 2006. From February 2013 to February 2018, I led the third extensive voluntary update to the patient reminder and recall systematic review. This update involved screening approximately 5,000 scientific abstracts and fully reviewing more than 300 published articles. This systematic review was published in the Cochrane Library in January 2018. The 2018 publication has been cited at least 127 times, and two earlier versions were cited at least 673 times. I presented the results of this study, focusing on vaccination information systems and related interventions, at the 2017 American Public Health Association Annual Meeting in Atlanta, Georgia in November 2017. I also presented a poster focusing on the full systematic review at the 2017 International Society for Vaccines Annual Congress, which was held in Paris, France during October 2017. The results of this research have been widely publicized. I was interviewed by National Public Radio

(NPR) for the NPR Morning Edition. The results of this study were featured on Evidently Cochrane, the National Institute for Health Research in the United Kingdom, Med India, Med Page Today, Health Medicine Network, EurekAlert, Infection Control Today, Bioportfolio, and in the journal Infectious Diseases in Children. Examples of press releases are listed after my summary statements. My colleagues and I continue to work on a related systematic review, more narrowly focused on evaluating the effectiveness of centralized reminder systems, such as vaccination registries. In December, 2020, the Director of Cochrane South Africa, South African Medical Research Council, and Professor in the Department of Global Health at Stellenbosch University invited me to collaborate with their team in South Africa on a Cochrane Collaboration systematic literature review on various strategies to increase vaccinations. We are also preparing for our next update to the 2018 patient reminder-recall systematic review.

In my work with a North Carolina (NC) Medicaid demonstration program, I collaborated with other clinicians and scientists to conduct and evaluate initiatives aimed at improving the health of children and adults. Prior to the closing of one of the large Community Care of North Carolina provider networks in about 2018, I worked collaboratively with the leadership to develop an operational foundation to continue some of the performance improvement initiatives that I had been involved with for about 14 years. The mission of this foundation, the Innovation Health Center, is to support the delivery of high-quality evidence-based health services for children enrolled in North Carolina Medicaid by conducting demonstration projects, program implementation and dissemination, research and evaluation aimed at improving health services delivery for children. This foundation is working with UNC-Chapel Hill and Duke on initiatives aimed at improving care delivery for children with medical complexity in the first year after discharge from the neonatal intensive care unit and adolescents with diabetes. One School of Nursing graduate student worked on her Masters' practicum project on this UNC-Duke child health initiative under my guidance.

Historically, through the NC Medicaid program, in collaboration with UNC and other clinical partners, we implemented and evaluated a series of performance improvement projects aimed at improving dietary and physical activity behaviors among children up to 12 years of age. Because pediatricians have reported low confidence in their obesity-related counseling skills in several studies, we assessed whether equipping resident and community pediatricians with a brief training and practical rapid screening and counseling tools improved their perceived confidence, ease, and frequency of counseling for obesity prevention and treatment. We also assessed whether this intervention was associated with more accurate parental perception of children's weight status and improvements in children's dietary and physical activity behaviors. My role was project director and co-investigator. I also worked on interdisciplinary clinical teams to develop, implement and evaluate interventions aimed at improving self-care and health outcomes among children with poorly controlled diabetes, and for adults with stage 3 or 4 chronic kidney disease.

Consistent with my goals to work on improving population health, I worked on a meaningful short-term project for the Big Ten Academic Alliance ("Big Ten"). I led the development of an initial written plan for all the Big Ten Universities and their respective State Departments of Health. This initiative aims to reduce health disparities in the Big Ten states by adopting the World Health Organization's Health in All Policies approach. Our plan was presented to the

Provosts of the Big Ten universities and was the foundation for the Big Ten to seek planning grant funding to move forward with this strategic initiative.

My future research plans involve ongoing efforts aimed at improving vaccination uptake. The Cochrane Collaboration has requested that we prepare for another update of our systematic review on immunization delivery relatively soon. When time permits, I plan to initiate formative research for my healthy schools environmental health initiative that aims to engage school nurses in implementing the Schoolchildren's Health Act in North Carolina.

TEACHING STATEMENT

As a faculty member in the UNC-Chapel Hill School of Nursing, I have taught a wide range of courses in the Master's, undergraduate, and doctoral program, spanning: Financing for Value-Based Care; Managing Human Resources in Complex Health Care Systems; Health Care Policy and Leadership; Public Health Nursing didactic and clinical; Population Health and Epidemiology; Nursing, Health Organizations and Policymaking in the Context of Ethics and Law; Leadership in Organizations; and Health Care Systems Residency. My specific areas of expertise and passion are health care policy, health care finance, epidemiology, population health, public health, and evidence-based practice. This diversity in topics challenges me to constantly update my knowledge base on topics that are continually evolving, for example, with respect to policies and new scientific evidence.

In each course, I emphasize current issues and policies and their implications for nursing and population health, and the process of identifying and applying scientific evidence to decision-making in any context. In addition, I apply case examples and content from my extensive program development, management and evaluation experience. For example, in *Health Care Policy and Leadership*, students analyze components of the North Carolina Medicaid Managed Care 1115 Demonstration Waiver and propose alternative approaches or modifications to the initiative based on evidence. In *Managing Human Resources in Complex Health Care Systems*, the major semester project is an organizational problem analysis in which students must identify evidence-based approaches to solving a real problem that involves managing or working with nurses or other health services employees. Students are expected to utilize a structured framework for analyzing each potential solution and select one solution based on available evidence. And, in *Financing for Value-Based Care*, students are asked to develop a business case for a new program or service, applying content from throughout the course. To support students in their community-based clinical placements, I have developed toolkits and resources to support the conduct of populations assessment, and intervention planning and evaluation.

My overarching teaching philosophy is that the goal of education is learning, and my role is to facilitate and engage students in the learning process. I am working to increasingly apply adult learning principles to help students see the relevance of the learning experience, allow students to demonstrate and apply what they already know, and to engage students in the process through experiential learning and varied teaching strategies. I have applied various teaching and learning strategies from the book "*Collaborative Learning Techniques*," and from consultations with UNC Center for Faculty Excellence. For example, in Public Health Nursing I have designed and implemented health coaching and motivational interviewing applied learning experiences in

which students practice these skills in triads, acting as a coach, client and observer. Students are encouraged to apply these skills by working collaboratively with at least one client in a clinical setting for the duration of the semester on behavior change. During the COVID-19 pandemic, some students applied these concepts while making driveway visits to older adults in the community. The longitudinal experience allows students to see the slow yet important progress that may be achieved using these behavior change strategies. In the course *Managing Human Resources in Complex Health Care Systems*, I use an online discussion forum to identify students' top three things they would like to learn from the course, and three human resource problems or challenges they have observed in working with nurses or other health care employees. Students' responses are used to reformulate online discussion questions to enhance the perceived relevance of the discussions to students. I also often provide students with three or four discussion question options so that they can seek out additional information on a topic of greatest interest to themselves, and they can learn about other topics from their peers.

With the Master's program now transitioning to an online approach, I am learning about and applying various technologies that may support this transition. For example, within the course *Financing for Value-Based Care*, I have begun to create short recorded whiteboard presentations to demonstrate financial management concepts, such as an overview of conducting indirect cost allocation. Because this and other concepts can be challenging for students to grasp, I use a range of tools, resources, and teaching strategies to reinforce concepts and to provide different methods that may work with students with different learning styles.

SERVICE and ENGAGEMENT STATEMENT (if applicable)

I serve as a reviewer for several journals, the American Public Health Association annual meeting, Association of Community Health Nursing Educators Annual Institute, and have served on the editorial board of the Journal of Nutrition Education and Behavior. I typically review approximately one manuscript per month and have also reviewed and participated in the selection of the best article of the year and best great educational materials. I conduct these reviews methodically, providing detailed constructive feedback aimed at helping the authors enhance their manuscript quality.

My service also involves working with several entities in Chatham County, North Carolina. Recently, I joined the COVID-19 vaccination planning and distribution group in Chatham County. This multi-disciplinary and multi-agency team meets weekly to discuss and plan COVID-19 vaccination roll out. I also participate in Chatham Health Alliance activities. Several years ago, I was assigned to teach Public Health Nursing Clinical in Chatham County. To better understand the health needs and services in Chatham County, I began attending the Chatham Health Alliance meetings and participated in the Access to Healthcare Subcommittee. Based on assessments conducted in Chatham County, I provided the School of Nursing with a summary outlining the potential need for services, such as a walk-in clinic, in Chatham County. I met with the former director of the Alliance to work with her on evaluation plans for their Exercise Is Medicine initiative I also participated in door-to-door interviews for the Chatham County Community Assessment during 2018. My involvement with the Chatham County Health Alliance meetings and activities has helped me to better understand the health needs of Chatham County residents and to strengthen my relationship with agencies in Chatham County. It has also

provided access to partnering agencies that enhance the learning experiences for students enrolled in Public Health Nursing clinical.

I worked to re-establish relationships with several nursing faculty members at the School of Health Sciences, Macao Polytechnic Institute. I worked collaboratively with the faculty in Macao; we launched an online shared learning experience in spring 2019 for a small group of students in Macao and one group at UNC SON. This focused on providing opportunities for students at both universities to learn about health services delivery in the other country.
