

Finding and Selecting Evidence Based Interventions

Program Description: This highly interactive workshop provides an overview of two sources for locating evidence-based interventions: (1) websites (e.g., Community Guide and What Works for Health) and (2) databases of journal articles. Participants are introduced to a three step process for searching for evidence-based interventions as well as criteria for selecting the best intervention. Didactic presentation is coupled with hands on activities during which participants apply what they have learned.

- Find evidence-based interventions (EBIs)
- Apply criteria to assess EBIs based on their effectiveness
- Determine potential for implementation in real-world practice
- Describe basic principles for selecting EBIs that fit your objectives, setting, and population
